CMS Physics week proposal 11th of September - 15th of September 2011 Brussels, Belgium



Joint proposal by the Brussels universities to organize the CMS Physics week in September 2011

Following the call for candidate venues for the external CMS Physics week, this document serves as a proposal by the Brussels universities.

We have about 36 members in the CMS collaboration working in divers areas, some key examples are Tracker design-construction-reconstruction-maintenance, RPC's construction, Computing (eg. TIER-2), Top Quark PAG, Exotica PAG, b-tag POG, JetMET POG, e-gamma POG, ...

We are embedded in the Inter-university Institute for High Energies (IIHE) of about 70 members in projects like CMS, IceCube, H1, R&D, PET, ... and closely connected to theory & pheno groups (eg. the MadGraph group, SUSY pheno and not to forget R. Brout and F. Englert as co-founders of the mechanism of spontaneous symmetry breaking) and the Solvay Institutes who celebrate in 2011 their 100th anniversary.



Main points of our proposal:

- Although the Belgian HEP community covers a divers spectrum of research topics, for its participation in the LHC endeavour it is solidly united in the CMS collaboration since the beginning.
- The period 11-15 September guarantees an almost student free campus, hence no long queues in the restaurant (4 to 8 euro per lunch) and many auditoria are available. During these dates Brussels is not overwhelmed by tourists.
- The campus is embedded in a green area and is a stimulating environment for informal discussions. The buffet-style restaurant is on the campus site.
- Brussels is easily reachable with frequent and often inexpensive flights via all the important international airlines from around the world (daily 7 direct flights from Geneva are available with SN Brussels Airlines and an extra 2-3 flights with EasyJet) (more then 10 daily direct flights to the US with divers companies).
- Brussels is a city with a long and successful tradition for many divers congresses. Some of the most famous ones in our field...



Access

- University area easily and frequently reachable via public transport from center (bus, tram or metro), it takes ~15 min
- Airport frequented every ~15
 minutes by public transport to
 center (duration ~20 minutes)

Scientific meetings (university campus)

- Main auditorium has 1200 seats with flip desk seats
- Additional smaller or medium size auditoria available if needed
- Fully equipped for audio/video
- We will foresee wireless internet
- Extensive sport facilities and restaurant on campus
- Our institute is on the campus
- Secretary area and discussion area possible in the main auditorium building





The registration fee will be small due to the use of university facilities. Lunch is offered at very democratic prices.

We will apply for funding both from the FWO and FNRS. This would result in a maximal total of 8500 euro's. If we receive this funding we plan to spend part of this money to support young researchers and the remaining general logistic costs.

We will try to host a list of young researchers on the university campus in guestrooms.


There are many sight-seeing programs in Brussels to fill a free afternoon. We will investigate all options.
